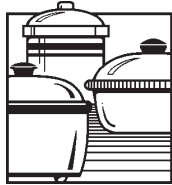

ICON PAINTING WORKSHOP

Monday, May 10 ~ Friday, May 14, 2010

Consider treating yourself to this wonderful faith journey where no artistic talent is necessary. You will embark on a contemplative, prayerful and spiritual experience as you are guided in the painting process by guest teacher and iconographer Teresa Harrison. This year, Teresa will be coming from California to teach at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church located on 12th Avenue. You will trace the outline of an icon on a blessed, wooden board and learn brush stroke techniques that will enable you to create a glorious icon. Teresa explains that "each brush stroke is intended to be a prayer." You will be inspired as you receive a glimpse of the Kingdom through this transforming experience. This workshop will offer your choice between writing Christ, the Good Shepherd (Jesus holding a lamb) or Virgin Mary, the Intercessor. First time-iconographers welcomed and encouraged! This workshop is being hosted by St. Christopher's; however, registration for all participants will be handled by volunteer Beth Partington of Christ Church. Members of all faiths and churches are welcome to attend. Over the course of this five-day workshop (Monday-Friday, 8:00 AM-4:00 PM most days), we will share meals together and reflect on our icon writing experience. JR. EYC (6th-8th grade)

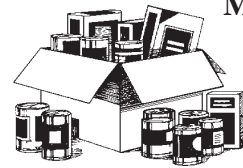
Wed afternoon Bible Study: Weekly Bible Study program from 2:30-4:00 in the Undercroft at Christ Church; continues through Lent.
